Easter Sunday

On Saturday afternoon, I invited our residents to my house to watch the movie Mel Gibson made, "The Passion of Christ." Watching the wrath poured out on Jesus, who had become our sin, I realized again how much God hates sin. Not only that, but how much God loves us, since, as Jesus, He endured to the end and "drank the whole cup" required ■ to be that perfect sacrifice to for-■ give us our sin. Scripture tells us that "whosoever will" may come to God. Our part is to willingly believe what the Bible says, recognize that we have a divine curse upon us because we have violated God's law, be willing to change our behavior, ask forgiveness, open our heart's ■ door and let Jesus in to take up residence within us.

On Easter Sunday we opened the service by listening to Bro. June singing "Via Dolorosa" (on CD). After that, our son Josiah played his guitar and sang "Three Days Later" (a song about the resurrection written by Bro. June). Then our oldest son, Michael, preached from the book of Romans about the Gospel of Christ being the power of God unto salvation.

After church we observed the Lord's Supper which moved me to tears of sorrow and thankfulness as I partook. I recognized, with sorrow, my part in the suffering of Jesus, and, with thankfulness, that the penalty of/for my sin had been paid, that I have been given a new life and am bound for an eternity in a Heaven I don't deserve.

He Was a Sunday "Christian"

Sadly, on Monday morning following Easter Sunday, one of our residents who had been there for the sermon (whether he heard it or not, I cannot say) and had chosen to partake of the Lord's Supper afterward, became confrontational and verbally abusive, making terroristic threats about getting a gun and coming back and shooting up the place. I was in Nacogdoches and was very thankful Martin was in Livingston that morning because he had Greg call the police. They quickly came and saw to it that the man left GODTEL property.

Many people are Easter and Christmas "Christians" but if you are not a Christian all the time, you aren't one at all.

Why on a Monday?

So, just why was Martin in Livingston early that Monday morning—rather than his usual Thursday? He had come to see about getting final repairs made to the pickup truck that I had my "Valentines Day Adventure" in. The final hurdle was getting a fuse installed. We are very thankful we had the \$3,000 to make all the repairs and get the truck up and useful again. (How we miss Bro. June's auto mechanic-ing skills!)

Uncharitable Thoughts

I was recently reminded of a man who, years ago, often passed by GODTEL on his way to town with his parents. As they passed, he would think things like, "Those people are scary," and, "I will never stay at a homeless shelter."

He grew up, went to work, COVID hit, his job was lost and he soon became homeless. With nowhere else to turn, he came to GODTEL. He told us what his previous thoughts had been but now realized he was one of "them." He also learned to never say, "Never," and understood how quickly life can change.

He showed his appreciation for our help by complying with our rules, getting a job, saving his money, and moving out when he had saved enough for move-in fees and first month's expenses.
