The next thing I heard was my voice saying, "Thank You, Lord," over and over until the pain subsided.

Hebrews 13:15 says, "By Him therefore let us offer the sacrifice of

praise to God continually, that is the fruit of our lips giving thanks to His name."

As I lay there for a few moments, letting my body and mind catch up to what had just happened, I looked up and saw the wondrous creation of the tree God had made, and somehow, not understanding why, I seemed to feel at ease. My friend Catherine came to help me up and then all the places that hit the concrete when I fell came to life! (And, boy, did they ever!)

When I moved any part of my body or tried to walk, I just kept saying, "Thank You,, Lord." By this, I was showing my obedience to the Lord as Ephesians 5:20 says, "Giving thanks always for all things unto God and the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ."

I knew I had to depend on the Lord in order for me to keep functioning throughout the rest of the day.

I was told that I needed to just sit down and let others help do my work, but in my heart I knew that was not going to happen. Reason being, sitting down would have meant that I quit and if I quit, that meant that I gave up, and if I gave up, the Lord couldn't (or wouldn't) help me. Believe you me, I needed ALL of His help to get through this. I was very thankful that I was surrounded by friends and co-workers who helped wherever and whenever they could. When the Lord wants your attention, He often does quite the unexpected to get it. In this case, a small rock jutted up into my pathway, with painful consequences for me. Everything we experience has a God-permitted purpose. He wants us to learn from the experience.

I am still not sure exactly what it is He wanted to show me, but looking back, it may have been to slow me down or to show others that if you put all your cares and burdens on Him, depending totally on Him, He will take care of you, no matter what happens.

When the Lord wants your attention, He often does quite the unexpected to get it.

He says in Hebrews 13:5, "Let your conversation be without covetousness; and be content with such things as ye have: for He hath said, 'I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee.'" And in Hebrews 13:6, "So that we may boldly say, 'The Lord is my helper, and I will not fear what man shall do unto me.'"

For the next few days following my "meet the concrete incident," I was totally in His caring hands. He made sure donations of food came in so I wouldn't have to cook, there were only a few loads of clothes to wash, and our Christian Help Center (where we give away clothing to the public three days a week) was not very busy. My body slowly healed as I rested in Him. He made sure the pain was not so great that I needed any painrelieving medication. (All I needed was His love.)

I am always saying, "Thank You," for every step I take and for every breath He lets me breathe. When you totally rely on Him for everything, His love for you takes over and fills you with His gentle touch, His grace, and His mercy.

He loves you and me so much that He let His only begotten Son go through much, much more pain than I, or you, could ever experience in our lifetime.
